MESSAGES from the office:

DRIVER'S EDUCATION- 2ND INTAKE

There will be a second intake of Driver Education candidates for the winter schedule.

Students eligible for this group are those **born on or before March 31, 2002**.

Students must go to SGI and register for a reference number (2 pieces of ID are required-birth certificate and health card).

The dates of the in-class sessions are:

Thursday, Jan. 26, 2017- all day [note this is the last day of final exams- no grade 9 or 10 exams will be scheduled this day- this day was chosen to minimize the impact on instructional time]

Friday, Jan. 27, 2017- all day [note semester turn around day-no classes for any other students-buses will not be running so students must find their own transportation to school- this day was chosen to minimize the impact on instructional time]

Wednesday, March 1, 2017- all day

Tuesday, March 7, 2017- all day

A synervice email will be forwarded to families eligible for Driver's Education in the next couple of weeks.

Winter regulations for Bus/Town Students as per GSSD Administration Procedures Manual - Transportation Safety - Procedure 550

Parents are reminded that students **must be properly dressed to suit the extremes of winter** weather. This includes proper headgear, mitts or gloves and footwear. They should, at the same time, be reminded that the bus driver can refuse to transport those students who do not abide by these regulations. (AP 4.12; 4.13)

It is suggested that when the **wind chill value is -45 degrees Celsius** or colder, **or the temperature is -40 degrees Celsius** or colder school **bus routes will be cancelled** by the driver. The bus driver will then contact the Principal of the schools affected and the parents on the route. (AP 4.1) Listen to GX94 (AM) for bus cancellations.

In situations where severe weather conditions occur or weather conditions have deteriorated after the students have been transported to school, no school bus shall transport students home until regular dismissal time. (AP 4.3)

If the conditions are such that it is **not safe for the buses to take rural students home**, parents will be notified and where **necessary billets will be utilized**. (AP 4.4) In anticipation of such an event, verify with your child and the school who the designated billet will be.

Expectations for students when buses do not run:

Schools are open for students who are able to attend.

Attendance will be taken and recorded for all students, with "weather" being given as the reason for absence of bus students who are unable to attend due to poor weather.

Students who attend classes will be given meaningful instruction. Students who do not attend classes will be provided with an opportunity to make up lost instruction/evaluation time.

STUDENT SERVICES: Ms. LeSann

Many **post-secondary campuses offer some tours** where high school students can spend a day and perhaps even get some counselling. Ask me to help you arrange one of these days for the school of your choice. Each grade 12 is allowed one of these exploration days per semester without being marked absent here as long as s/he can afford the time away from class.

The SAT test is recommended and often required if you are planning on attending college in the U.S.A or Internationally. Students in grade 11 are encouraged to take the SAT if they are interested in attending school in the USA or internationally. Your son/daughter must pre-register online at www.sat.collegeboard.org. If you are interested in taking the SAT's they will be offered two more times this academic year. We are scheduled to be a test centre on the following dates: Jan 21st and June 3rd. Information packages are available at Student Services if you do require more information.

You **may now apply directly into the College of Education at the University of Regina and the University of Saskatchewan.** The deadline for the Teacher Education Application is March 1st for both universities. Check the University of Regina webpage to ensure you meet the requirements for grade 12 courses at: <http://www.uregina.ca/futurestudents/admissions/hs-students/saskatchewan/index.html>. Check the University of Saskatchewan webpage to ensure you meet the requirements for grade 12 courses at <http://explore.usask.ca/programs/colleges/education/index.php>. You may consult this webpage at any time to see if you meet the grade twelve requirements for admission to a variety of programs at the University of Regina or Saskatchewan.

Apply now to Sask. Polytech to insure your acceptance to the program you are interested. Students can apply today to get his/her file started there. If you have applied please consistently check your account for new or updated information from Sask Polytech

Final June marks must be ordered from the Ministry of Education. Students and guardians must complete a request for High School Transcripts form. The Ministry of Education will then forward the final transcript of marks directly to the institutions you applied in July.

Most universities are now accepting applications to attend their institution and students should now be completing their applications for early admission. Start becoming familiar with the websites of potential schools to discover their individual requirements. If you require assistance to fill out your university applications please come to student services.

Entrance scholarship applications are generally earlier than application deadlines, for example, the U of S scholarship application deadline is February 15, and the U of R deadline varies depending upon the scholarships that are being applied for. Look at the website for the post secondary school of your choice; the websites are most up to date and accurate.

Deadline for University of Saskatchewan Best and Brightest Scholarship is December 15th, 2016. In order to apply you must have sent in your application.
