Esterhazy High School




The front entrance was renovated to include the payroll area on the main floor, the Director & Deputy Director space on the top floor, a lift between the first and second floor, and the front reception area




This open area was transformed into the Transportation and Facilities wing

On behalf of students, staff, and families - thank you to Good Spirit School Division for providing our school with a great start to our days with our new entrances and updated classroom!"



"The changes to the foods lab makes things a lot better because the work stations have changed and are more open. The open space lets us speak with our teacher from our work areas. Communicating is easier."




Yorkton Regional High School
