Cheer with stunts	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	 Instructors will have a strong cheerleading or gymnastics background. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Students in grades K-5 will not take part in cheerleading with stunts. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Cricket	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 The official game of Cricket will not be played with students in grades K-6. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Curling	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students from grades K-3 will not participate in this activity. The administrator will be provided with a schedule of all off-site activities. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		

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Diving	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students from grades K-5 will not participate in this activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. The administrator will be provided with a schedule of all off-site activities. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Equestrian	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual Saskatchewan Horse Federation	 Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. The administrator will be provided with a schedule of all off-site activities. All participants will have a Saskatchewan Horse Federation (SHF) membership. This membership comes with liability insurance and accident, death, and dismemberment insurance that protects the child/youth when participating in equestrian related activities. On-site supervision by a certified NCCP (National Coach Certification Program) Equestrian Instructor/Coach will be provided at all times for all equine activities and for all instruction/coaching. Approved ASTM certified equestrian specific riding helmets must be worn when working around or riding horses. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision meet the minimum requirements. 		
Fencing	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 * Equine therapy must be approved by the school SSC Certified instructors will be used to lead the class. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision meet the minimum requirements.

A sponge puck or rubber ball is required for "shinny" activities. The administrator will be provided with a schedule of all off-site activities. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Lacrosse	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u> <u>Lacrosse</u> <u>Canada</u>	 Students in grades K-6 will only participate in lacrosse-type games but never full box or field lacrosse games. Goalies will not be used. Helmets or protective eyewear will be used by all participants. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Martial Arts and Combat Sports	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Qualified instructors will be used to deliver the program. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Outdoor Education Canoeing or Kayaking	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	 Students in grades K-5 will not participate in canoeing or kayaking activities. A minimum of one instructor will be certified in First Aid as well as Paddle Canada Canoeing Basics and Lake Canoe Intro. The administrator will review the trip route and particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. A teacher/student ratio of 1:10 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		

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Outdoor Education Ice Fishing	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u> <u>Saskatchewan</u> <u>Regulations</u>	 Students in grades K-3 will not participate in ice-fishing activities. The administrator will review the trip particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. All local fishing guidelines will be adhered to. No student will walk on ice less than 4" or 10 cm thick and no vehicle will drive on ice less than 12" or 30 cm. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. A teacher/student ratio of 1:10 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Outdoor Education Lake Swimming	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students in grades K-6 will not lake swim. A minimum of one instructor will be certified in N.L.S. or all students will wear PFD's when in the water. The administrator will review the trip particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. A teacher/student ratio of 1:10 for students in grades 7-9 and 1:15 for students in grades 10-12 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Outdoor Education Mountain Biking	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students in grades K-4 will not participate in mountain biking activities. The administrator will review the trip particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. At least one supervisor will be certified in first aid. A teacher/student ratio of 1:10 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		

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Outdoor Education Sailing		Good Spirit School Division does not sanction sailing.		
Outdoor Education Skiing Snowboarding	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	 The administrator will review the trip particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. At least one supervisor will be certified in first aid. A teacher/student ratio of the following will be established: 1:8 ratio (Grades K-3) of supervisors to students. 1:15 ratio (Grades 4-6) of supervisors to students. 1:20 ratio (Grades 7-9) of supervisors to students. 1:30 ratio (Grades 10-12) of supervisors to students. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Outdoor Education Winter Camping	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students in grades K-9 will not participate in winter camping. The administrator will review the trip particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. At least one supervisor will be certified in first aid. A teacher/student ratio of 1:15 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met.

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Scuba Diving	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students in grades K-6 will not participate in scuba diving. The administrator will review the particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. A certified diving instructor will be in the water with students during any in-water instruction. A teacher/student ratio of 1:12 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Snorkeling	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	 Students in grades K-4 will not participate in snorkeling. The administrator will review the particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Constant visual supervision by a certified NLS Lifeguard will be maintained. A teacher/student ratio of 1:12 will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Swimming and Water Polo	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	 The administrator will review the particulars with the lead teachers prior to approving the activity. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Constant visual supervision by a certified NLS Lifeguard will be maintained. A supervisor & lifeguard/student ratio of the following will be established: 1:4 (Pre-K to Grade 3) 1:8 (Pre-K to Grade 3 if life jackets / PFDs are worn by all children) 1:10 ratio (Grades 4-12) Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Tackle Football		Good Spirit School Division does not sanction this activity as an activity to be taught in Physical Education class.		

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Track & Field Javelin	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	 Students in grades K-5 will not participate in javelin. Appropriate supervision will be established. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Track & Field Pole Vaulting	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Students in grades K-8 will not participate in pole vaulting. Appropriate supervision will be established. For Grades 9-12 students must undergo specific pole vault training from a certified instructor. Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Proper equipment will be used. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision requirements are met. 		
Trampoline		Good Spirit School Division does not sanction.		
Water Parks	AP 215 Physical Activity Safety Manual	 Constant visual supervision by a certified NLS Lifeguard will be maintained. A supervisor/student ratio of the following will be established: 1:4 (Pre-K to Grade 3) 1:8 (Pre-K to Grade 3 if life jackets / PFDs are worn by all children) 1:10 ratio (Grades 4-12) Written consent from all caregivers will be collected before students will be allowed to participate. Both the instructors and I have reviewed the Physical Activity Safety Manual (AP 215) to ensure that the equipment, facilities, instruction, and supervision meet the outlined requirements. 		
Zip Lining	<u>AP 215</u> <u>Physical</u> <u>Activity Safety</u> <u>Manual</u>	Zip Lining is a High-Risk Activity. Teachers who wish to participate in Zip Lining require written permission from the Director of Education or designate.
