SMUDGING

Background

Good Spirit School Division supports the belief that the inclusion of Indigenous perspectives and the Indigenous knowledge is of benefit to all students.

Procedures

- 1. Smudging is an aspect of traditional ways of knowing and is therefore accommodated in appropriate designated spaces.
- 2. Participation in smudging is always <u>voluntary</u>. Students or staff will never be forced or pressured to smudge they may refrain from participating.
- 3. Smudging will occur in consultation with the Indigenous consultant, school-based administration, school staff and may involve Elders or Knowledge Keepers.
- 4. When smudging takes place, there will be staff supervision.
- 5. Parents/Guardians will be notified at the start of the school year indicating that smudging will occur within the school. Parents/Guardians may notify the school that they wish to have their child excluded from participation.
- 6. Smudging is permitted within Good Spirit facilities in an enclosed public space providing that:
 - 6.1. The space is adequately ventilated;
 - 6.2. The space is of sufficient size to accommodate the event and meets capacity and fire code regulations; and,
 - 6.3. Signage is posted indicating that smudging is occurring within the building.
- 8. Requests for smudging within Good Spirit facilities, outside of regular school hours, requires consultation with the Indigenous consultant. Any community use agreements shall stipulate compliance with this administrative procedure as a condition of use.

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
