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Eligibility Criteria:

- The student and the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) must be Permanent Residents of Saskatchewan. Exchange, visa, and foreign students are not eligible.
- The student must be in regular attendance as defined by local policy.
- The student must complete the requirements for Grade 12 graduation under the regular 24 credit program during the high school academic year.
- The student must obtain a minimum of 6 course credits within the academic year.
- The student's average must be calculated in accordance with the *Transcript of Secondary Level Achievement* issued by the Ministry of Education using the following criteria to determine which courses are eligible for consideration:
 - Each applicant's academic standing shall be determined by averaging the final marks for seven (7) 30-level courses as follows: English Language Arts A 30; English Language Arts B 30; one (1) of Social Studies 30, History 30 or Native Studies 30; one (1) 30-level science; one (1) 30-level mathematics; and two (2) 30-level electives for the year ending June 30. Comparable courses offered in French are also acceptable.
 - All marks obtained prior to June 30 of that school year, including retakes and supplementals, are accepted.
 - Averages should be calculated to one decimal place.
