- 3. Reference Checks: Three people who have known you for a minimum of two years is required
- 4. Pre-Match Training: to make sure that your experience is fulfilling.
- 5. If approved a Match is proposed.
- 6. Match Meeting: Caseworker introduces everyone.
- 7. Follow-up: Caseworker provides ongoing support.
