GPS (Global Positioning Software) on School Buses

Background

The Division has a responsibility to ensure that safe transportation services are provided for students, staff and volunteers. The Division also has a responsibility to run an efficient transportation system. In providing safety and efficiency, the school division endorses the use of GPS (Global Positioning Software) on school buses.

Access to Information

- 1. Access to the GPS system and website is restricted to those employees in the Transportation Department who require the information to perform their duties.
- 2. Persons with access to the GPS system and website will have restricted access to real time data, historical data, or both, based on their user-specific needs.
- 3. Personal information will not be disclosed outside the school board except if required where disclosure is appropriate in the circumstances or where consent is present.

Information will be used to:

- 1. Locate buses and provide rescue assistance in emergency situations.
- 2. Generate data regarding student ride times for monitoring, reporting and compliance with government guidelines.
- 3. Assist in the planning of efficient bus routes and to verify that routes are driven as planned.
- 4. Monitor safe driving practices such as proper use of loading lights, correct procedures for railway crossings, and driver speeds.
- 5. Monitor bus idle times to promote efficiency.
- 6. Generate distances for calculating driver salaries.
- 7. As needed, provide data for high-level vehicle utilization reporting at senior levels to allow comparisons and analysis of productivity.
- 8. When necessary, investigate a complaint from a member of the public, investigate concerns raised internally and address productivity issues.
