Information for the Board (10 fast facts):

- 1. **Accountability to Provincial Standards:** The Board must adhere strictly to provincial educational standards and statutory requirements (GSSD Policy 2).
- 2. **Community Engagement:** Decisions must reflect community values and interests, ensuring transparency and providing clear opportunities for community input (GSSD Policy 2).
- 3. **Ethical Standards:** Board members are expected to act ethically, prioritizing public interests and maintaining integrity to enhance public trust (GSSD Policy 4 Appendix A).
- 4. **Confidentiality and Privacy:** Board members must protect confidential information, ensuring the privacy of individuals and safeguarding sensitive data (GSSD Policy 4).
- 5. **Strategic Planning and Accountability:** The Board annually establishes strategic directions, priorities, and outcomes, ensuring continuous improvement in education (GSSD Policy 2).
- 6. **Educational Advocacy:** Board members must actively advocate for educational interests, communicate clearly with stakeholders, and engage with community partners (GSSD Policy 2).
- 7. **Recognition of Indigenous Governance:** Understanding and acknowledging that Indigenous Peoples have inherent rights and unique governance systems that coexist with federal, provincial, and municipal systems (SSBA, Who Governs Us? Educator's Guide).
- 8. **Civic Responsibility and Decision Making:** Board members must encourage informed community involvement in democratic processes, recognizing their role in shaping educational policy and governance structures (SSBA Educator's Guide: Governance & Decision Making).
- 9. **Board Solidarity:** Members must uphold and support collective Board decisions publicly, reinforcing unity and stability within governance (GSSD Policy 3).
- 10. **Continuous Improvement:** The Board should continuously evaluate its effectiveness, ensuring policies and decisions align with the evolving needs of the educational community (SSBA Educator's Guide: Governance Systems & Evaluation).
