Kashton shared: "We were under the direction of Scott Leithead and Kitbielle Pasagui, and Kingsley and I were two of seven people from Saskatchewan. The ECHC is a national level choir of 40-50 members, that learn 10-13 pieces a year that should be fully memorized by the end of the week. It moves between Toronto and Niagara every year. We performed twice in one day after four days of learning the music."

Congratulations to Kingsley and Kashton for being selected to perform in a choir of this magnitude - an incredible honour that reflects their dedication, talent, and passion for music at the highest level.


### SAGE MANKO & MARION AJIBOYE

### Kael is known for his quiet confidence, making him a respected and well-rounded individual!












### **KAITLYN SLINGERLAND**
