Responding to feedback about ride times and capacity concerns, they added a new route in the Stockholm attendance area to better serve students and families.

From ensuring the safe operation of over 100 buses and 98 routes to tackling challenges like bus driver recruitment, the team goes above and beyond. Proactive measures, including recruitment incentives and celebrating Bus Driver Appreciation Day with thoughtful tokens, highlight their commitment to exceeding expectations. The Bus Garage Teams prioritize safety by maintaining buses in excellent condition through regular servicing.



The team's solutions-focused approach is evident in their efforts to lower ride times and provide 15-passenger van training, finding ways to address operational challenges while prioritizing safety.
