The projects were a combination of various maintenance, repair, and upgrade initiatives. Through these ongoing efforts, GSSD continues to invest in creating spaces that support student success and staff well-being.

Churchbridge Public School



This classroom renovation project is in year two of four.

The school had five main floor classrooms upgraded with flooring, lighting, custom cabinetry and a teaching wall.



The kindergarten classroom got new cabinets, and the second-floor corridor had new flooring installed.

A sensory space was added to an upstairs classroom.

Outside, the barrier-free west entrance concrete was repaired.

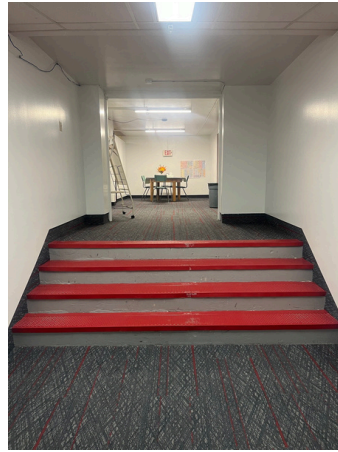
Columbia School

New asphalt was installed to promote better drainage around the portable classrooms and a path was added to the North entrance.



Dr. Brass School

The school basement area was renovated to support the needs of the Band and the Visual and Performing Arts Academies. The damaged concrete steps were also replaced at the main entrance, along with the concrete walk on both sides.



Grayson School

The main corridor in the school received a fresh new coat of paint.



Langenburg Central School

In the parking lot, jersey barriers and a gate were installed to limit the access to the shop area and retain traffic to the parking lot.

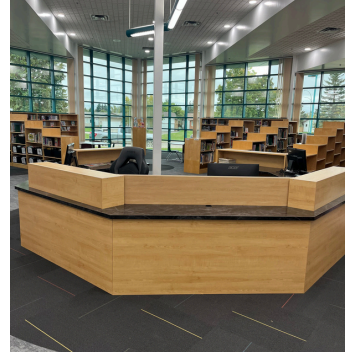
Macdonald School

The North entrance had broken, uneven concrete that was replaced with an asphalt surface.



MC Knoll School

In a jointly funded project in partnership with Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools, the library was renovated. The project included new flooring, paint, lighting, window treatments and a relocated circulation desk.



Norquay School

Washroom facilities were added to the junior wing. The senior staff washroom received a renovation to create an additional student washroom. An office and a base for a cultural room were also added.



Saltcoats School

This summer marked the second year of a three-year project, which included the renovation of three classrooms. Improvements included fresh paint, new flooring, new lighting, custom cabinetry and a teaching wall. The main entrance was made barrier-free with repaired sidewalk.



Springside School

A wall was added between the library and art room to create a classroom space, along with a new student support office.

Victoria School

Additional parking spaces in the parking lot were created by relocating the barrier-free playground access. A concrete berm was also installed in the playground area to contain the sand and define separate spaces.



Duct Cleaning

Duct cleaning was completed at Preeceville, Springside, Yorkdale and Victoria Schools.

Phone System Upgrades

Saltcoats, Columbia and Yorkton Regional High School had phone system upgrades completed this summer.

YRHS Mechanics and Welding Shop

Existing lighting was replaced with efficient LED fixtures.
